CAMP INFORMATION AND RULES

The Ingleside Scout Camp Committee welcomes you to the camp and hopes that your stay is enjoyable.

To assist you in making full use of the facilities of the camp and to ensure that your stay is as safe and pleasurable as possible, it would be appreciated if you would take the time to read the following information and ensure that each member of your group is aware of same.

ACCESS: Access to the camp is by authorised entry only.
The camp will be opened by a committee member on your arrival or will have been opened beforehand.

TIMES: Times of arrival and departure should as far as possible, be in accordance with the times provided on your application form to assist the Camp Warden in opening and closing the camp for your convenience.

PARKING: No vehicle access is allowed within the camp. Vehicles should be parked in the designated parking areas (see map) and securely locked.

COOKING FACILITIES: The kitchens in both the John Dyer Hut and Kinnersley Centre are fully equipped. You will need to bring your own eating utensils and plates.

LOW ROPES COURSE: Bookings must be made to use this activity as NO RESPONSIBILITY is accepted for users without permission or a qualified instructor.

SLEEPING: John Dyer Hut: Two dormitories – both have 10 beds (bunk style) all with mattresses. Main hall will accommodate approximately 30 children sleeping on the floor, must bring own lilo/sleeping mat.

Kinnersley Centre: Three dormitories – one with 19 beds (bunk style) and one with 17 beds (bunk style). One with 16 beds (bunk style) and one room located adjacent to the kitchen area has 4 beds (bunk style). All beds have mattresses.

Each member will need to provide their own sheets, blankets or sleeping bags and pillows.

TOILETS: The main toilet block has hot shower facilities. The toilets and showers in the John Dyer Hut and Kinnersley Centre are for emergency use only.

The floor in the main toilet block must be hosed out daily.

WATER: Water at the camp is supplied from tanks and care should be taken not to leave any taps running.

The water connected to the main toilet block is not suitable for drinking or cooking.

Drinking water is available from: -

- (a) Any taps within the John Dyer Hut and Kinnersley Centre.
- (b) the brown tank located outside the camping store (see map)
- (c) The tank at the rear of the dining shelter adjoining the John Dyer Hut.

(d) The tap on the outside eastern wall of the main toilet block.

FIRES: Campfires – allowed in the Campfire Circle only. Any metropolitan fire restrictions in force are to be strictly observed.

Cooking fires (campers) are to be constructed in the fire drums provided (old store see map)
No fires are permitted to be lit directly on the ground of the grassed campsites.
Trench cooking fires are not permitted.

Timber can be used from the woodpile near main toilet block along side main track.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: Fire extinguishers are provided for EMERGENCY USE ONLY.

If extinguishers are found to be empty and no evidence of a fire exists, then BOND monies will be retained to cover the cost of refilling them.

For Scouting Groups a bill will be forwarded, and prompt payment is desired.

GARBAGE: All garbage is to be placed in plastic garbage bags and placed in the wheelie bins provided. Wet pits are prohibited and no garbage is to be buried.

HYGIENE: Camp hygiene is to be observed at all times.

FOOTWEAR: In the interests of safety, suitable footwear is to be worn at all times – no thongs
Except for showering if required.

CHAPEL: The chapel is available for “Scouts Own” services at all times.

FIRST AID: You are requested to bring your own first aid kit. Mona Vale Hospital is the nearest
Hospital Phone No. 9998-0333.

TELEPHONE: A phone is located at the Eric Bell Hut. All calls must be paid for.

The camp phone no. is 9450-1759 and is only answerable when the camp is occupied.

EMERGENCY CALLS: Police, Fire and Ambulance phone no. is 000.
Camp address is BLOODWOOD RD, INGLESIDE. Opposite the Pittwater Animal Shelter.

ALCOHOL: Is not permitted within the confines of the camp except with the prior written
Approval of the Regional Commissioner.

RESTRICTED AREAS: The following areas are out of bounds – the dam and a distance of ten
metres therefrom: the water tanks at the rear of the main toilet block: the female
sleeping quarters and their toilet facilities by all male personnel when females are
in residence.

PITTWATER ANIMAL SHELTER (DOG POUND) IS OUT OF BOUNDS FOR ALL GROUPS IN

GENERAL: Live timber is not to be cut. Axes, tomahawks, machetes are prohibited.
